

What is a Case Manager?

A case manager is a trained professional who is like a social worker. She or he will listen to you, coach you, support your efforts, and try to help you get the things you need. A case manager will try to help you access the services you need to move forward with your life. She or he will try to speak up for you when you need a voice.

You may not be eligible for all services, but your case manager will try to get you linked to all services which you are eligible for.

Case management is a **FREE** service. All referrals for case management must come from your therapist or a TASC Intake staff person.

It may be possible to help you with any of the following:

- **HOUSING**
- **EMPLOYMENT**
- **BASIC NEEDS** (food, clothing, ID, etc.)
- **ACCESS TO WELFARE and/or SOCIAL SECURITY BENEFITS**
- **TRANSPORTATION**
- **BUDGETING**
- **LEGAL ASSISTANCE**
- **EDUCATION** (GED classes, Adult Basic, etc.)
